



Saint Patrick

His given name was **Maewyn**, was born at Kilpatrick, Scotland, in the year 387; died Ireland March, 17 493. His dad was Calphurnius from a Roman family of high rank in Britain. His mom Conchessa a near relative of the great patron of Gaul, St. Martin of Tours.

When Patrick was 16 years old he was carried off into slavery by Irish marauders and was sold as a slave. He told in his "**Confessio**" that during his 6 years in captivity while tending the flocks he prayed many times in the day: "the love of God". He added, "and the faith grew in me, and the spirit was roused, so that, in a single day, I have said as many as **a hundred prayers**, and in the night nearly the same."

While in slavery he studied under master Milchu (Druid high priest) named St. Germain for 12 years. During his training he became aware that his calling was to convert the Pagans in Ireland to Christianity. Because of a dream of an angel he fled from his cruel master by ship to Britain, but now his heart was set on devoting himself to the service of God. He adopted the Christian name **Patrick**, was appointed second bishop to Ireland.

Patrick was quite successful at converting the Irish people to Christianity so the Druid Priests did not like him. Patrick was arrested several times, but escaped each time. He traveled throughout Ireland, setting up schools and churches. His mission in Ireland lasted for thirty years. When Patrick was dying, he urged his friends to **celebrate** his exit into **everlasting life**. He died on **March 17 AD 461**. (now **St. Patrick's Day**).

Irish folklore about St. Patrick's Day

THE SERPENTS He miraculously drove snakes from Ireland by banging a drum, while giving a sermon.

THE SHAMROCK The pagan Irish had great difficulty understanding the doctrine of the **Trinity**, until he gave them a natural example by holding up a **three-leafed shamrock** to show the three leaves combined to make a single plant. This represents how the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit could all be separate together. The people understood, so the shamrock became the symbol of the Irishmen wear it in their hats on the Saint's day.

Irish heritage influence on the USA Nine people who signed the "Declaration of Independence" were Irish, and nineteen Presidents of the U.S. were Irish including our first President, George Washington.

The virtue of His Resurrection, His Ascension,
The virtue of His coming on the Judgement Day.

I bind to myself today
The virtue of the love of seraphim,
In the obedience of angels,
In the hope of resurrection unto reward,
In prayers of Patriarchs,
In predictions of Prophets,
In preaching of Apostles,
In faith of Confessors,
In purity of holy Virgins,
In deeds of righteous men.

I bind to myself today
The power of Heaven,
The light of the sun,
The brightness of the moon,
The splendour of fire,
The flashing of lightning,
The swiftness of wind,
The depth of sea,
The stability of earth,
The compactness of rocks.

I bind to myself today
God's Power to guide me,
God's Might to uphold me,
God's Wisdom to teach me,
God's Eye to watch over me,
God's Ear to hear me,
God's Word to give me speech,
God's Hand to guide me,
God's Way to lie before me,
God's Shield to shelter me,
God's Host to secure me,

Against the snares of demons,
Against the seductions of vices,
